Top Tips for Fundraising

Maximise your impact by following these guidelines:

 Introduce – let the students know why they are fundraising.

Involve – include the students in the brainstorming of ideas, planning and delivery of the event to increase their commitment and allow them to develop valuable skills.

Promote – ensure parents, friends groups and the local community are aware of the event as they may even have time and skills to offer to support you.

Celebrate – remember to celebrate your achievements and thank everyone involved after the event.

Share – share your success in your school newsletters, with your local newspaper and with us here at Hospice in the Weald.
